Ob in der deutschen der Zeitfaktor noch vorhanden ist, kann erst in den nächsten Tagen ermittelt werden.

Für alle, die Schwierigkeiten im Spiel haben, haben wir uns mal um eine engl. Lösung des englischen Spieles gekümmert.

Ich denke, sie kann an mancher Stelle weiterhelfen. Eine deutsche Lösung wird es ca. nächste Woche im Netz und auch bei uns zur Verfügung stehen.

PREFACE :-

UPDATE #1 (7 October 2002) :-

*Legacy Interactive have intimated that since a number of players have criticized the time restrictions imposed by the clock count-down, they will be issuing a patch some time fairly soon. Whether this will **completely** remove the time aspect from the game, or only partially, or 'by choice', I don't know.*

Due to this, I thought of deleting the times included here since they may (or may not) be irrelevant & redundant ... see {5}. However, I decided to leave them in, in case they are of any assistance. If they are useless, then just ignore them.

UPDATE #2 (11 October 2002) :-

The abovementioned patch has been released.

It makes the clock count-down run 10 times slower --- but only if you choose the "Efficiency Skill". This should more or less totally remove the 'time' limitation.

See {5} & {6} below.

(N.B. I haven't tried this, but I assume that it works well without disturbing anything else in the gameplay ???)

I have been informed that you will not be able to use any previous saves after you install the patch, as happens with some games but not with others.).

This patch also corrects at least one of the technical bugs which some players have encountered.

{1} During beta testing there were some difficulties necessitating the replacement of the part-1 CD. This caused ALL previous Saves to be unusable. To prevent the testers from wasting a LOT of time & causing them superfluous repetitive hassle, a basic no frills walkthrough for part-1 (only) was issued together with the replacement CD.

This walkthrough is based to a considerable degree (but not entirely) upon the one produced by "Legacy Interactive" ... and hence my thanks & acknowledgement to them.

{2} This walkthrough describes the absolute minimum actions (I think) which you must take in order to succeed.

However, please don't use this walkthrough UNLESS YOU ABSOLUTELY HAVE TO. Many items, actions, and even some 'secondary' locations which are not absolutely essential have been omitted. A lot of these are interesting and provide the background story to the game.

“WARNING” :- The main purpose of this game is to examine clues, interview witnesses & suspects, etc. Some of these actions are essential, but many are fruitless or even red herrings ... as in real life investigations.

If you simply take this walkthrough in your hand and follow exactly what to do & not to do, you can probably finish the game in about a couple of hours. This would completely destroy the whole purpose of the game!

{3} The object of the **first part** of L&O is for you to assist the detective (Lennie Briscoe) to arrest the correct suspect during 7 working days of 8 hours each. Most actions that you perform & questions that you ask (but not all) reduce your time, generally by ¼ hour or sometimes by ½ hour each. If you fail, you have to replay part or all of the game in order to advance to the second part of the game ... the trial.

In the **second part** of L&O, you help the Assistant District Attorney (A.D.A. ... Serena Southerlyn) to obtain a “Guilty” verdict at the subsequent trial of your suspect. This part is more complex since it consists of several watertight consecutive sections and will be described fully at the beginning of part-2.

{4} As opposed to most Quest/Adventure games, do NOT “pick up every item which is not nailed down” &/or try to perform every action possible. If you do this, you will very rapidly run out of time, and have to return to some previous stage. You have to restrict yourself to the **minimum** of essential items, actions & questions in order to conserve time as much as possible.

Note:- There is space for up to 52 items in the ‘inventory’ of your case file. If you want to store any additional, you can use the trash can to make room. But, be very careful how you do this. I don’t think you can reclaim any item once you have removed it ... and you might need it later for (essential) evidence!!

{5} **Note** :- *The “Updates” above are likely to modify (some of) this section :-*

I have inserted in **red** some ‘very average’ times left at various stages. You may have more time left (good), or less (not so good). However, if you just have ‘reasonable’ numbers of hours less, don’t worry because all the times which just happen to be listed here, finish with considerably more hours (in part-1, over 2 **DAYS**) to spare than necessary!

{6} At the beginning of both halves of the game you are prompted to select either one or a maximum of two out of four ‘skills’ (‘strengths’) ... the game will not permit you to select more than two!

Once you have made your choice at the very beginning **of each half**, **you will be UNABLE** to change your selection without returning again to the beginnings.

This walkthrough has made one of the *many* possible selections which enable you to finish each half of the game satisfactorily, and with scores of 100% each! It was possibly NOT the wisest choice!

In practice, it is probably better to adopt the following plan (similar to a strategy suggested in the game's manual) :-

{a} Use the "Evidence Collection" skill *throughout the whole game* to provide yourself with a magnifying glass which highlights all & only the items you can interact with ... if you do not choose it, you will have to perform very frustrating pixel hunts over the whole areas of some screens.

{b} Use also the "Efficiency" skill which allows you to roam around as much as you like whilst conserving time (*particularly if you've applied the patch and hence enabled almost unlimited time! ... see "Updates" above*).

{c} Once you get used to the game, it doesn't take long to restart and repeat what you've already played.

So if/when you get stuck or reach a dead end, restart, but use the "Teamwork" skill instead of "Efficiency" in order to obtain some helpful built in hints.

{d} Go back and forth between {b} & {c} as often as you need to!

{7} Whenever you see the cell-phone icon blinking you can click on it. Frequently you are given quite important clues hinting at what to do next, or sometimes *absolutely essential* info. But quite often you just get some purely background blurb which is not really vital to progressing in the game.

In part-1, if you have chosen the appropriate 'skill(s)', Van Buren writes hints from time to time on the chalkboard in the 27th Precinct. These are generally helpful if you are stuck! An equivalent situation applies in part-2 to faxes sent by the District Attorney, Douglas Wade, and received in the Assistant District Attorney's office.

However cell-phone calls generally "cost" ¼ hour, whilst accessing the chalkboard &/or faxes *always* do!

I've included ALL cell-phone time-deductions in this walkthrough since the game appears to imply this. But I have included NO time-deductions for chalkboard or faxes (since they may not be available in some 'skill-combinations').

Of course you can always 'cheat' with all these hints! Save immediately before accessing; access & obtain the info; then return to your Save with no time deduction :-)

{8} In general **SAVE FREQUENTLY**. It is *very* easy to make a wrong or redundant move!

You have 15 save-slots. If you like you can save batches of up to 15 'permanently' (zipping if you like) before overwriting.

PART-1 ... DETECTIVE

Select “Evidence Collection” and “Teamwork” ‘skills’, and then “Done”.

(See {6} in the “PREFACE” above)

Then watch the cut scenes displaying the discovery of the body at the crime scene.

7 days ... 0.00 hours.

Crime Scene.

[001] Question Ryan (Park maintenance man) :-

- (A) “So what time did you first see the victim?”.
- (B) “Had you ever seen her before?”.
- (C) “Did one of her tips go south on you?”.
- (D) “Can you tell us where you were before you found the victim?”.
- (E) “Would you mind moving your cart outside of the crime scene area for us?”.

[002] View close-up of water bottle.

[003] Add water bottle to case file.

[004] View torn business card #1 (to the right of Ryan & on his shadow).

[005] Add torn business card #1 to case file.

[006] View torn business card #2 (in front of the trash can).

[007] Add torn business card #2 to case file.

[008] View torn business card #3 (to the left of the ambulance & in front of some low bushes).

[009] Add torn business card #3 to case file.

[010] View business card puzzle (3 more pieces together of business card near to white cap “I Love New York”).

[011] Click on the 3 (first) torn pieces of business card separately in inventory panel whilst viewing the business card Puzzle. Each will jump onto the puzzle ... making a total of 6 pieces.

[012] Drag these 6 pieces until they fuse together into one full business card. (N.B. This could hardly be easier. The 6 pieces don’t even have to fit accurately!).

[013] View close-up of dog tag (name = “Bingo”; gray & not too easy to see ... near to the handbill “Save 25% on long distance calls”!).

[014] Add dog tag to case file.

Select case file.

[015] Submit water bottle to lab test (at Crime Lab).

6 days ... 5.50 hours.

Choose map and go to Leonard Gower (Gower Investments).

[016] Question Gower :-

- (A) "You know of anyone who might want to kill her?"
- (B) "Any of her clients unhappy with her performance?"
- (C) "Why did she leave her job here at Gower Investments?"
- (D) "Do you know where her family is located?"

Choose map and go to Saheed Singh (Singh, Wolfe & Singh).

[017] Question Singh :-

- (A) "Do you know why Ms. Russ left her job at Gower Investments?"
- (B) "What was so special about her disaster?"
- (C) "Were there a lot of people who wouldn't want to see that happen?"
- (D) "Was she going to make a deal with the Feds?"
- (E) "Was this her only deal the Feds were looking into?"

Choose map and go to Crime Lab (Paul Kim).

[018] View water bottle lab result.

Choose map and go to Bobby Sloan.

[019] Question Bobby Sloan :-

- (A) "What time did you see the victim?"
- (B) "Did you happen to notice if she carried a lot of cash on her?"
- (C) "Did you see her here with anyone that morning?"
- (D) "What kind of dog did the guy you saw have?"
- (E) "Did you hear what the victim and the guy were talking about?"
- (F) "Would you recognize the man if you saw him again?"
- (G) "Did the victim and the man she was with leave together?"
- (H) "What time did your supplier get to you?"

[020] Add Bobby Sloan to case file (*whilst his Q/A sheet is still on screen*).

6 days ... 0.25 hours.

Select case file.

[021] Submit Bobby Sloan for research report.

Choose map and go to Laurie Russ.

[022] Question Laurie Russ :-

- (A) "Do you know anyone who might have wanted to see her dead?"
- (B) "Were you an investor in any of your mother's deals?"
- (C) "Why were you and your mother on bad terms?"
- (D) "Do you run every morning?"
- (E) "Did anyone see you running around 5am on May 10th?"

Choose map and go to Medical Examiner's (M.E.'s) office.

[023] View hair from under victim's (vic's) fingernails.

[024] Add the hair to case file.

[025] View saliva from victim's body.

[026] Add the saliva to case file.

- [027] View watch from victim's wrist.
- [028] Add watch to case file.
- [029] View metal traces from victim's neck.
- [030] View victim's blood sample.
- [031] Add blood sample to case file.
- [032] View victim's money belt.
- [033] Click on (silver) key just protruding from bottom right corner of money belt purse, obtaining a close-up.
- [034] Add key to case file.
- [035] View autopsy report.
- [036] Add autopsy report to case file.

Select case file.

- [037] Submit hair from under vic's fingernails to lab test.
- [038] Submit saliva from victim's body to lab test.
- [039] Submit blood sample to lab test.

5 days ... 4.50 hours.

Choose map and go to Victim's residence.

- [040] Go to and view the locked drawer in the desk in the living room.
- [041] Click on the silver key icon in your partial case file (which should be on the right hand side of the same screen), obtaining a close-up of the opened drawer with a golden key inside it.
- [042] Click on your "Add to case file" icon (bottom mid screen). This will add the (golden) key to your case file.
- [043] View the waste box under the desk.
- [044] Click on the white note inside the waste box, obtaining a close-up of it ... it's from somebody called Lucy.
- [045] View the photo on the desk.
- [046] Click on the flower painting above the table.
- [047] Note the dial pad on the safe and enter it's code number.
- [048] If you can't guess it, repeat [045].
- [049] Look (again) at the time in the top left hand corner of the photo.
{If you are really REALLY stuck the number is 40718}
- [050] View the white document on the left hand side of the lower shelf ... it is the ownership deed of the apartment; it belongs to a Bartholomew Corchran.

Select case file.

- [051] Submit (golden) key to research.

5 days ... 3.00 hours.

Choose map and go to Bart Corchran.

[052] Question Bart Corchran :-

- (A) "How long had you known the victim?"
- (B) "Did she have any enemies?"
- (C) "So why did you buy her that apartment?"
- (D) "So did you leave her or was it the other way round?"
- (E) "We have to ask you where you were on the morning of May 10. Around 5 a.m.?"
- (F) "Did she run everyday?"
- (G) "Do you know if the victim had a dog?"

Choose map and go to Crime Lab.

[053] View lab test on hair.

[054] Add lab test on hair to case file.

[055] View lab test on blood.

[056] Add lab test on blood to case file.

[057] View lab test on saliva.

[058] Add lab test on saliva to case file.

[5 days ... 0.00 hours.](#)

Choose map (if necessary) and go to the 27th Precinct (Records & Surveillance).

[059] Enter "Records & Research" (Scott Donovan).

[060] View research report on Bobby Sloan.

[061] Add research report on Bobby Sloan to case file.

[062] View research report on gold key.

[063] Add research report on gold key to case file.

Choose map and go to Bart Corchran.

[064] Question Bart Corchran :-

- (A) "Why were you at the safety deposit box the day before her murder?"
- (B) "Maybe the same documents Jenny was looking for? Since she went there a few hours after you?"
- (C) "Maybe there was something in that safe deposit box that implicated you in the I.P.O. catastrophe?"
- (D) "Did you lose a lot of money on the Bio-Norm I.P.O. deal?"

[4 days ... 5.75 hours.](#)

Choose map and go to Lucy Traine.

[065] Question Lucy Traine :-

- (A) "You sure it wasn't because you had lost most of your savings?"
- (B) "Were you upset she didn't call you before the Bio-Norm stock tanked?"
- (C) "Did you know Jenny was the target of a federal investigation into her trading?"
- (D) "When was the last time you spoke with her?"
- (E) "Happen to be running in the park the morning of May 10th?"
- (F) "Did Jenny have a dog?"

[066] Add Lucy Traine to case file (*whilst her Q/A sheet is still on screen*).

Choose map and go to Bart Corchran.

[067] Question Bart Corchran :-

- (A) “Why did you lie?”.
- (B) “What did you two argue about?”.
- (C) “Maybe she was mad because you took her PDA from the safe deposit box, and that was the evidence she needed?”.
- (D) “You knew her morning jogging routine, didn’t you?”.

[068] Add Bart Corchran to case file (*whilst his Q/A sheet is still on screen*).

Select case file.

[069] Obtain a search warrant.

- (A) Click on (yellow) search warrant tab ... on the right.
- (B) Drag your ‘suspect’ into the “Search Warrant Request” window.
- (C) Drag into the box marked “Supporting Evidence & Witnesses”, whatever icons you think are necessary.
- (D) Click on “Submit”.

[070] (B) should be Bart Corchran.

[071] (C) should be {i} Lucy Traine & {ii} The gold key research report.
[4 days ... 2.50 hours.](#)

Inside Bart Corchran’s apartment.

[072] The search warrant has been obtained and you are in his apartment.

[073] In the hallway:- View the 2 albums ... red on the right, and green on the left.

[074] Click/open the red album and view the photograph of Corchran & Laurie Russ together on vacation.

[075] In the kitchen:- View the picture postcard on the refrigerator.

[076] In the bedroom:- View Corchran’s laptop on his desk.

[077] Enter Corchran’s password.

[078] If you don’t know it, click on “Forgot your password” ... this brings up the name Monique.

[079] If that doesn’t help, return to [075].

[080] Still stumped? “Bermuda isn’t the same without u” !!

[081] The password is **Bermda**.

[082] After you have typed (on your keyboard) the correct password and entered the laptop’s desktop, add laptop to case file.

[083] In the bedroom:- Open the top left hand drawer in the dresser, and see the victim’s PDA.

[084] Add victim’s PDA to case file.

Select case file.

[085] Submit Corchran’s laptop to research.

[086] Submit victim's PDA to research.

4 days ... 1.25 hours.

Choose map and go to Laurie Russ.

[087] Question Laurie Russ :-

- (A) "Did your mom sue you for him, too?"
- (B) "Did you know he had dumped her?"
- (C) "By the way, have you got a dog?"

Choose map and go to the Crime Scene.

[088] View furthest trash can ... in the far corner of the crime scene.

[089] Click/view close-up of betting sheet in trash can.

[090] Add betting sheet to case file.

Choose map (if necessary) and go to the 27th Precinct.

[091] Enter "Records & Research".

[092] View victim's PDA research report.

[093] Add victim's PDA research report to case file.

[094] View laptop research report.

3 days ... 6.00 hours.

Choose map and go to Lucas Allen (L&G Associates).

[095] Question Lucas Allen :-

- (A) "Did you know Jennie Russ?"
- (B) "Who is Stanton?"
- (C) "What happened on this last deal?"
- (D) "Did everyone at L&G lose money on that deal?"
- (E) "Did that winning streak you all seemed to be in on come with a little insider help?"
- (F) Do you have an alibi for the early morning of May 10?

Choose map and go to James Stanton.

[096] Question James Stanton :-

- (A) "How much did you lose on the deal?"
- (B) "Didn't you make a lot of money on some of her other deals?"
- (C) "How did you become so interested in the bets Russ made while she was at Gower Investments?"
- (D) "Did you recommend her plays to your colleagues?"
- (E) "So how did you get that bruise on your forehead?"
- (F) "You happen to be a dog lover?"
- (G) "Where were you around 5.15 a.m. on May 10?"

[097] Add James Stanton to case file (*whilst his Q/A sheet is still on screen*).

3 days ... 2.75 hours.

Select case file.

[098] Submit Stanton to research.

[099] Submit Stanton for surveillance.

Choose map and go to Bobby Sloan.

[100] Question Bobby Sloan :-

“His name’s James Stanton. Is he the guy you saw with the victim?”.

[101] Click on the betting sheet icon in your partial case file (which should be on the right hand side of the same screen).

[102] Click on the Bobby Sloan research report icon ... in your partial case file.

[103] Question Bobby Sloan :-

“Are you absolutely sure that the man in the picture is the one you saw with the victim?”.

3 days ... 1.50 hours.

Choose map (if necessary) and go to the 27th Precinct.

[104] It’s quite likely that you may have to mark time here ... if the reports are still pending.

If so, visit and talk to anybody (e.g. the M.E., &/or Leonard Gower, etc.) as many times as necessary until the reports are ready.

N.B. You’ll get a cell-phone call from Mark Rawlins when the surveillance report is available!

[105] Enter “Surveillance Unit”.

[106] View Stanton surveillance report.

[107] Add Stanton surveillance report to case file.

[108] Enter “Records & Research”.

[109] View Stanton research report.

[110] Add Stanton research report to case file.

Choose map and go to Dr. Martinez (Veterinary Hospital).

[111] Question Dr. Consuelo Martinez :-

(A) “What happened to the dog?”.

(B) “Did Mr. Stanton leave anything of the dog’s behind? A leash?”.

(C) “What was the dog’s name?”.

[112] Add C. Martinez to case file (*whilst her Q/A sheet is still on screen*).

2 days ... 6.00 hours.

Select case file.

[113] Obtain a search warrant.

(A) Click on (yellow) search warrant tab ... on the right.

(B) Drag your ‘suspect’ into the “Search Warrant Request” window.

(C) Drag into the box marked “Supporting Evidence & Witnesses”, whatever icons you think are necessary.

(D) Click on “Submit”.

[114] (B) should be James Stanton.

[115] (C) should be {i} Dr. Martinez; {ii} Bobby Sloan; {iii} (Bingo) dog

tag; {iv} James Stanton research report.

Inside James Stanton's residence.

[116] The search warrant has been obtained and you are in his apartment.

[117] In the living room:- View couch pillow.

[118] Add couch pillow to case file.

[119] In the bedroom (Enter via the {closed} door in the kitchen):- View the clothing, obtaining a close-up of the gloves, necktie & belt.

[120] Click/view the black gloves obtaining their close-up.

[121] Add gloves to case file exposing the butt of a gun on the extreme left hand side.

[122] Click on gun obtaining its close-up.

[123] Add gun to case file.

[124] Click on living room door to get to hallway.

[125] Go down hallway to foyer.

[126] View package addressed to George Stanton ... It's not too easy to see since most of it is hidden underneath the chair in the corner near the elevator.

[127] Add package to case file.

2 days ... 4.25 hours.

Select case file.

[128] Submit package to lab test.

[129] Submit couch pillow to lab test.

Choose map and go to Crime Lab.

[130] It's quite likely that you may have to mark time here ... if the reports are still pending.

If so, visit and talk to anybody (you may have to talk to 2 or even 3 people ... as many times as necessary) e.g. the M.E., &/or James Stanton, &/or Lucas Allen, etc. until the reports are ready.

N.B. You'll get a cell-phone call from Paul Kim when the lab reports are available!

[131] View lab test on couch pillow.

[132] Add lab test on couch pillow to case file.

[133] View lab test on package.

[134] Add lab test on package to case file.

2 days ... 1.00 hours.

Select case file.

[135] Obtain an arrest warrant.

(A) Click on (yellow) arrest warrant tab ... on the right.

(B) Drag your suspect into the "Arrest Warrant Request" window.

- (C) Drag into the box marked “Supporting Evidence & Witnesses”, whatever icons you think are necessary. **NOTE** :- If you want to use more than 6 items, you can easily do so by utilizing the slider on the right side of the panel!
- (D) Click on “Submit?”.

[136] (B) should be James Stanton.

[137] (C) should be {i} Dr. Martinez; {ii} Bobby Sloan; {iii} (Bingo) dog tag; {iv} James Stanton research report; {v} Lab tested package addressed to George Stanton; {vi} Lab tested couch pillow; {vii} Lab tested hair from Vic’s nails.

[138] If you’ve submitted suitable items, the District Attorney (I presume) will agree, somewhat reluctantly, to send Stanton for trial. Watch the cut-scenes which will lead you to part-2 (Lawyer) of the game.

If not, you will have to repeat with an improved selection of items.

If you’ve done EVERYTHING ‘correctly’ in part-1, you will obtain :-
“Detective Score: 100%”.

But don’t worry if you got less than this!

So long as you’ve succeeded in progressing to part-2 (the trial), the “Detective Score” will have no influence (one way or the other) upon your finishing the game successfully.

PART-2 ... LAWYER

PREFACE :-

The object of the second part of L&O is for you to help the Prosecution’s Assistant District Attorney (A.D.A. ... Serena Southerlyn) to obtain a trial verdict of “Guilty”. It is actually divided into 7 watertight sections. They are in a fixed order ... if/when you succeed in one section, you can proceed to the next.

So keep Saving; frequently!

PART-2A :- The Prosecution has 2 (8 hour) days to investigate before the actual trial itself begins.

PART-2B :- The trial begins:-

The Prosecution selects its witnesses & items of evidence.

The A.D.A. questions all its witnesses and presents its evidence.

Defense Attorney, Miles Duncan, cross examines some of the Prosecution’s witnesses. Then the A.D.A. rests its case.

If you have not presented your case well enough, it will be summarily dismissed ... **FAILURE**.

If however you have presented your case satisfactorily, you'll have further time for investigation.

PART-2C :- The Prosecution has a further 2 (8 hour) days to investigate before the Defense presents its case.

PART-2D :- The trial continues:-

The Defense questions all its witnesses and then rests its case.

PART-2E :- The Prosecution has a final 2 (8 hour) days to investigate before presenting its Rebuttal Subpoena.

PART-2F :- The trial continues:-

The Prosecution again selects its witnesses & items of evidence.

The A.D.A. presents its Rebuttal Subpoena.

Then the Prosecution rests its final case.

PART-2G :- **Cut-scenes :-**

The Prosecution and the Defense make their closing summaries.

The jury retires and then delivers its judgment of "Not Guilty" (BAD) or "Guilty" (**YOU'VE "WON"!**) ... you will also be given your %age score.

Select "Evidence Collection" and "Teamwork" 'skills', and then "Done".

(See {6} in the "PREFACE" above)

[139] View indictment document.

[140] View Instruction sheet from Douglas Wade to A.D.A.

[141] View Law Computer ... particularly the sections on "Questioning the Witnesses in Court" & "Hearsay Rule".

Part-2A :- PROSECUTION INVESTIGATION~1.

The Prosecution has 2 (8 hour) days to investigate before the actual trial itself begins.

Select case file.

[142] Submit Stanton's gun to lab test.

[143] Submit Stanton for psychiatric evaluation.

1 days ... 7.25 hours.

Choose map and go to Crime Lab.

It's more than likely that you may have to mark time here ... if the reports are still pending. If so, visit and talk to *anybody*. You may have to talk to 3 or maybe even 4 people ... as many times as necessary until the reports are ready.

N.B. You'll get a cell-phone call from Paul Kim when the lab reports are available!

- (C) "When did you give the gun to Stanton?"
- (D) "Did Stanton say why he needed a gun?"
- (E) "Who told you Stanton needed a gun?"
- (F) "C'mon, what can you give us on Stanton?"

[147] You will again obtain a partial case file on the right hand side of the screen. But there is nothing you can do with it **at present** ... so exit!

[148] Add Barney Ruggerio to case file (*whilst his Q/A sheet is still on screen*).

Select case file.

[149] Submit Barney Ruggerio for surveillance

Listen to cell-phone message.

[150] Listen to phone message from Donovan about Stanton and the "Produce Truckers Union" (PTU).

1 day ... 2.00 hours.

Choose map and go to Herb Gardner (Produce Truckers' Union).

[151] Question Herb Gardner.

- (A) "What exactly were Stanton's responsibilities?"
- (B) "Did Stanton report to you?"
- (C) "Did you notice anything irregular about his investment activities?"

- (D) “Did you know a woman named Jenny Russ?.”
- (E) “Why would Stanton have asked one of your union members to get him a gun?”.
- (F) “Do you know a union member named Barney Ruggerio?”.
- (G) “Did you know Stanton set himself up in business with a million dollar trading account after he left the union?”.
- (H) “Does your union generally hand out generous severance packages?”.

1 day ... 0.00 hours.

Choose map and go to psychiatrist.

[152] View James Stanton’s psychiatric report.

[153] Add Stanton’s psychiatric report to case file.

0 days ... 7.25 hours.

Part-2B :- THE TRIAL.

Select case file.

[154] **GO TO TRIAL.**

- (A) Click on (yellow) subpoena tab ... on the right.
- (B) Drag your witnesses into the “Prosecution Witness List” window.
- (C) Drag into the box marked “Prosecution Evidence List”, whatever icons you think are necessary. **NOTE** :- If you want to use more than 6 items, you can easily do so by utilizing the slider on the right side of the panel!
- (D) Click on “Go to Trial”.
- (E) You get the message “Are you sure you are ready to go to trial” ... answer “Yes”. Watch the cut-scene of the Prosecution’s opening case.
- (F) Select your witnesses, one after the other for questioning.

[157] Question Bobby Sloan :-

- (A) “On the morning of May 10, did you see the victim, Jenny Russ, speaking with a man while she was purchasing water at your coffee cart?”.

- (C) “Were Ms. Russ and the defendant speaking?”.
- (D) “Did you hear what they were speaking about?”.
- (E) “Did Mr. Stanton have a dog with him?”.

Defense Cross Examination.

[158] Object to Duncan question – “Two hundred. That’s a lot of people and I suppose you always remember them all?”.

[159] Object to Duncan question – “Wasn’t the man unhappy because someone simply tried to get in line ahead of him?”.

Select Lucy Traine from witness list.

[160] Question Lucy Traine :-

- (A) “Were you a close friend of the victim’s?”.
- (B) “Can you tell the court if Ms. Russ owned a dog?”.
- (C) “Did you ever see her pet a dog?”.
- (D) “Did Ms. Russ ever speak with you about her other investors?”.

Defense Cross Examination.

[161] Object to Duncan question – “And you were angry with her because you realized she wasn’t such a good friend after all, weren’t you?”.

Prosecution Redirect.

[162] “Why did you leave that note for the victim?”.

Select Consuelo Martinez from witness list.

[163] Question Consuelo Martinez :-

- (A) How long had you provided veterinary care to Mr. Stanton’s dog.
- (B) What was the dog’s name?
- (C) When was the last time you treated Stanton’s dog?

Defense Cross Examination.

[164] Object to Duncan question – “In your opinion as a licensed veterinarian, had the dog eaten rat poison when Mr. Stanton was not at home?”.

Select Detective Lennie Briscoe from witness list.

Select pillow with hair from topic list.

[165] Question Detective Lenny Briscoe :-

- (A) “During your interview with the defendant, did you ask him about owning a dog?”.
- (B) “Did you find evidence of a dog’s presence when you searched the defendant’s residence?”.

Select dog tag from topic list.

- [166] (C) “Did you find evidence of a dog’s presence at the crime scene?”.
(D) “Subsequent to your interview with Stanton, what did your investigation reveal?”.

Defense Cross Examination.

- [167] Object to Duncan question – “Wasn’t the dog tag you found in the park lying there for many days before the murder?”.

Select Scott Donovan from witness list.

Select James Stanton’s background check from topic list.

- [168] Question Scott Donovan :-
(A) “What did the phone records show about communications between the defendant and the victim just before the murder?”.
(B) “How much money did the defendant lose on the Bio-Norm Industries I.P.O., Ms. Russ’ last deal before she left her job at Gower Investments?”
(C) “Do your records show how that loss affected the defendant’s general financial situation?”.

Defense Cross Examination.

- [169] Object to Duncan question – “Isn’t it true that on the day trading was suspended on that particular IPO, many people could have had motive to kill Jenny Russ?”.

Select Ann Galloway from witness list.

Select James Stanton’s Psychiatric Evaluation from topic list.

- [170] Question Ann Galloway :-
(A) “During your evaluation what did you observe when discussing James Stanton’s financial situation?”.
(B) “Did Mr. Stanton express anger toward the victim?”.

Defense Cross Examination.

Don’t object to ANY questions during Galloway’s cross examination by the Defense.

Prosecution Redirect.

- [171] (A) “Did the defendant tell you how he felt about putting his dog to sleep?”.
(B) “Based on your evaluation, do you think he could have killed his dog on purpose?”.

Select Kathleen McDonnell from witness list.

Select autopsy report from topic list.

- [172] Question Kathleen McDonnell :-
“What was the victim’s cause of death?”.

Select victim’s watch from topic list :-

- [173] Continue questioning Kathleen McDonnell :-

- (A) “Besides the neck wound, were there any other injuries?”.
- (B) “Does the broken watch suggest a struggle?”.

Select Mark Rawlins from witness list.

Select James Stanton’s Surveillance Report from topic list.

[174] Question Mark Rawlins :-

“Can you tell this court your observations during your surveillance of the defendant?”.

Select Paul Kim from witness list.

Select lab tested dog hair from topic list.

[175] Question Paul Kim :-

“What were your findings regarding the hairs from the victim’s nails and the hairs from the defendant’s apartment?”.

[176] Continue questioning Paul Kim :-

Select lab tested victim’s blood from topic list.

“What did your analysis of the victim’s blood reveal?”.

[177] Continue questioning Paul Kim :-

Select lab tested saliva from topic list.

- (A) “What was the result of your analysis of the saliva on the victim’s face?”
- (B) “As though a dog had licked her face?”.

[178] **SELECT “REST CASE”**

Part-2C :- PROSECUTION INVESTIGATION~2.

The Prosecution again has 2 (8 hour) days to investigate before the Defense presents its case.

2 days ... 0.00 hours.

[179] **Listen to cell-phone message.**

Listen to phone message from Donovan about Stanton :-

“We’ve been following the paper trail of Stanton’s trades DNP Brokerage firm (Union Pensions fund) etc”

[180] **Listen to cell-phone message.**

Listen to phone message from Rawlins about Barney Ruggerio :-

‘So far nothing new to report on his surveillance of Barney Ruggerio ...’

[181] **Listen to cell-phone message.**

Listen to phone message from Donovan about Corchran :-

“We finally got into Corchran’s trading accounts etc.”

Choose map and go to Saheed Singh.

[182] Question Saheed Singh :-

- (A) “Did the government become suspicious because her trades at DNP were so profitable?”.
- (B) “What was the evidence Jenny said she had?”.
- (C) “Did you know she kept an electronic file on her business activities locked in a safety deposit box?”.

- (D) “Who else besides Stanton was Jenny afraid of?”.
- (E) “What kind of protection do you think Jenny was looking for?”.

1day... 6.25 hours.

Choose map and go to Christina Brannon (Justice Dept.).

[183] Question Christina Brannon :-

“Can you give us anything on Russ’ alleged criminal activities?”.

[184] Click on the PDA research report icon in your partial case file (which should be on the right hand side of the same screen).

N.B. it seems that the ‘ordinary’ PDA icon itself is also OK!

[185] Continue questioning Christina Brannon.

- (A) “So have we got a deal then?”.
- (B) “Didn’t Russ and Stanton trade together when she worked at DNP?”.
- (C) “Do you think Jenny Russ was being paid by the Mafia?”.
- (D) “How much control does the Mafia have in the PTU?”.
- (E) “So can you help us nail Stanton?”.

1day... 4.75 hours.

Part-2D :- CASE FOR THE DEFENSE.

Choose map and go to Court House.

Charlie Ryan ~ Direct Examination (By Duncan – Defense).

[186] *Object to Duncan question* – “you’ve never seen the defendant before, have you?”.

Charlie Ryan ~ Cross Examination (By A.D.A. - Prosecution).

[187] Question Charlie Ryan :-

- (A) “Can you tell the court how this other woman was dressed?”.
- (B) “Have you ever seen joggers stop and speak with each other during their morning exercise before?”.

Bart Corchran ~ Direct Examination (By Duncan – Defense).

[188] *Object to Duncan question* – “So high strung that she had to take anti-depressants to get over your affair?”.

[189] *Object to Duncan question* – “But you were enraged with the victim when you dropped her off at her apartment the night before her murder, weren’t you?”.

Bart Corchran ~ Cross Examination (By A.D.A. - Prosecution).

[190] Question Bart Corchran :-

“On the morning of May 10th at about five AM where were you?”

James Stanton ~ Direct Examination (By Duncan – Defense).

[191] *Object to Duncan question* – “Didn’t the intimidation tactics employed by the detectives cause you to withhold that information?”.

[192] *Object to Duncan question* – “Which means there were plenty of people who

were more upset about it than you were, weren't there?"

[193] Object to Duncan question – “Mr. Stanton, you had absolutely no reason to want to harm Jenny Russ, did you?”

James Stanton ~ Cross Examination (By A.D.A. - Prosecution).

[194] Question James Stanton :-

- (A) “How much money did you lose on Russ’ Bio-Norm Industries I.P.O.?”
- (B) “Was that the first time you lost money on one of her deals?”
- (C) “Isn’t it a fact that you knew the victim had helped her big investors cash out of that deal before they would sustain such large losses as yours?”
- (D) “In your previous job as manager of the PTU Pension Fund, did the victim handle many of your fund investments while she was at DNP Brokerage?”
- (E) Did you know that the victim’s trading activities during the time you conducted business with her were also under federal investigation?”
- (F) “Since the PTU was also under investigation, had anyone contacted you to give testimony about your investment activities?”
- (G) “Your severance package with the union was very generous, wasn’t it?”
- (H) “How was it that after you left your union position, you set yourself up as a trader with an opening account of \$1,000,000?”
- (I) “Didn’t the union give you that money so you’d keep quiet about their shady investments when you managed their pension fund?”
- (J) “Didn’t the victim have information on your illegal trading activities that you feared she would give to the Justice Department as part of her deal with them?”

Eva Stanton ~ Direct Examination (By Duncan – Defense).

[195] Object to Duncan question – “During that time your husband never mentioned Jenny Russ, did he?”

[196] Object to Duncan question – “Your husband has never behaved in a violent manner, has he?”

Eva Stanton ~ Cross Examination (By A.D.A. - Prosecution).

[197] Question Eva Stanton :-

- (A) “You have said that you and your ex-husband did not speak often about money, correct?”
- (B) “Then how is it you were also an investor in the Bio-Norm I.P.O. deal your ex-husband took such a big loss on?”
- (C) “How is it that you were one of the investors who managed to get your money out before these shares nose-dived?”
- (D) What is illegal according to the government, is if the victim warned you to get out of this investment based on insider information, isn’t it?”
- (E) “Then who told you? Your husband?”
- (F) “Did the defendant ever speak to you about why he didn’t get his own money out of Bio-Norm Industries?”
- (G) (*Prosecution reply/’argument’ ... accepted by the judge*) :- “The witness does not meet the requirements of spousal privilege since she and the defendant are no longer married.”

- (H) “And did you know that your ex-husband had, in fact, done something wrong?”.

Choose map and go to Barney Ruggerio.

[201] Click on the Ruggerio surveillance icon in your partial case file (which should be on the right hand side of the same screen ...See [147])

[202] Question Barney Ruggerio :-

- (A) “Would you rather we pin the charge on you for the dead one or the one with bandaids who's still breathing?”.
- (B) What was your problem with Singh? “
- (C) “Who gave you the assignment of keeping Singh quiet?”
- (D) “What can you give us on Stanton?”
- (E) “Did Stanton tell you why he wanted the gun?”

1 day ... 5.50 hours.

Choose map and go to Saheed Singh.

[203] Question Saheed Singh :-

- (A) “Has Ruggerio or anyone from the union ever approached you before?”.
- (B) “Did Jenny Russ tell you about her financial transactions when she worked for the union?”.

Choose map and go to Lucas Allen.

[204] Question Lucas Allen :-

- (A) “How much money did you lose on the Bio-Norm I.P.O.?”.
- (B) “How about you tell us why Stanton lost so much when he knew the stock was going to tank ahead of time?”.
- (C) “How about we put in a good word for you with the feds?”.
- (D) “What if we can get you a deal from the Feds?”.

[205] You will again obtain a partial case file on the right hand side of the screen. But there is nothing you can do with it **at present** ... so exit!

[206] Add Lucas Allen to case file (*whilst her Q/A sheet is still on screen*).

1 day ... 3.50 hours.

Choose map and go to Christina Brannon.

[207] Question Christina Brannon :-

- (A) “Would you be willing to make a deal with Allen in exchange for his coming clean?”.
- (B) How about offering him immunity?”.

Choose map (if necessary) and go to A.D.A.’s office.

[208] View fax to A.D.A. from Christina Brannon ... on table next to bulletin board.

[209] Add fax to case file.

Choose map and go to Lucas Allen.

[210] Click on the fax icon in your partial case file (which should be on the right hand side of the same screen ... See [205]).

1 day ... 2.00 hours.

Part-2F :- PROSECUTION REBUTTAL.

[211] Prosecution proceeds with rebuttal.

- (A) Click on (yellow) rebuttal tab ... on the right.
- (B) Drag your witnesses into the “Rebuttal Witness List” window.

- (B) “So when Mr. Stanton got to L&G and Ms. Russ started at Gower they basically just used the same scam?”.
- (C) “Were you concerned about the general public?”.
- (D) “Did Stanton mention to you that Jenny Russ could incriminate him for any reason?”.

Defense Cross Examination.

Don't object to questions during Lucas Allen's cross examination by the Defense.

Select Barney Ruggerio from witness list.

[215] Question Barney Ruggerio :-

- (A) "Have you ever met the defendant?"
- (B) "Have you seen him since he left his position at the union?"
- (C) "And then what?"
- (D) "Did Mr. Stanton say why he needed the gun?"
- (E) "Do you know who those people were?"
- (F) "After you sold Mr. Stanton the gun, did you see him again?"
- (G) "Was that the morning of May 10th, the day Jenny Russ was murdered?"

The Defense objects with "Hearsay ... Strike from the record!"

- (H) The Prosecution's response ... "The statement should be admitted as an admission against the defendant's interests."

This is accepted by the judge with "Objection Overruled".

- (I) "When did you next see Mr. Stanton?"

Defense Cross Examination.

[216] Object to Duncan question – "Security, you mean like beating people up?"

[217] **SELECT "CLOSING ARGUMENT"**

Part-2G :- Prosecution & Defense Closing Arguments & VERDICT!

SEE CUT-SCENE OF PROSECUTION & DEFENSE CLOSING ARGUMENTS AND VERDICT!
And then ... FINAL WRAP-UP SCENE.

If you've done EVERYTHING 'correctly' in part-2, you will obtain :-
